#### Member Spotlight: Barbara Boylan

KSSC Member for 39 Years

KSSC was founded in 1972. Barbara joined in 1979. You do the math; she has been part of KSSC for all but seven years of our existence. She has served our club in multiple rolls including President. What a treasure!

Barbara is a native of Louisville. One of

nine children, she grew up in the Highlands and was a Pres Girl (a graduate of Presentation Academy). TT asked about her dogs as a child, and was surprised to learn that she never had a



dog growing up; a brother was asthmatic. However, she has more than made up for that as an adult.

Barbara's first stop after graduation was three years in the Army - stationed at Fort Knox. After that service she returned to Louisville where she completed training in nursing earning her LPN. Soon to follow was a return to military service - this time in the the Air Force - where she was stationed in Colorado. It was time for a dog. She started out looking for a Collie, but ended up with a Sheltie - the next best thing. (She says that Shelties were much closer to Collies in those days.) She found her first Sheltie - a Tri that was born silver but who would turned mostly black as an adult. She named the puppy Star. In those earlier years she also had Russian Wolfhounds!

Life and work took her to Pennsylvania and New York, but she returned to Louisville, where she worked as a nurse, and continued her service to our country in the Army National Guard. She was deployed to Washington D.C. in support of Desert Storm.

Through the years she has bred Shelties through her Krown Kennel; shown her dogs at five Sheltie Nationals; and ran a Sheltie Rescue for five years. Today she (Member Spotlight continued...)

lives with Eclipse, eight years old, who is the great granddaughter of her first bi-black; Charade, a twelve month old blue merle; and Lilly, an Italian Greyhound now 14 years old whose first role was to exercise her Shelties! While Barbara started in the Conformation Ring, these days you'll find her working her dogs in Rally.

When asked what she liked best about our breed, she replied, "Their temperament. Reserved, NOT shy. They are smart and an all around dog that can do just about anything."

Sounds like our Barbara - Smart; and who has done just about anything and everything for Shelties and the Kentuckiana Shetland Sheepdog Club.
