Time for college and she was off to Bloomington and IU to the vexation of her parents (both Purdue graduates).

She was on track to major in English and Psychology until she encountered Statistics, which convinced her to drop the double major! TT asked what she had planned to do with her English degree. She recounted that the truth was that while walking across campus one day pondering just what she might do in the real world as an English major, *I found myself paying to God that it be anything other than teaching*. After receiving her degree, Peg was hired to teach 9th Grade English at Garrett High School (in a rural area northeast of Fort Wayne), where for the next four years she found she actually enjoyed teaching English.

During this time *at the old age of 21, I married the wrong man, but escaped 10 years later.* The best part of those years are her two daughters (the elder lives in Louisville with her husband and daughter age 17 and son age 9; while the younger is is a horsewoman who lives on a farm in the St. Louis area with her two border collies, and competes in Agility.)

While Peg took a short break from teaching to focus on family she also completed a Master's in English from IU. When she returned to teaching, it was to Middle School English in the Fort Wayne Community Schools. As teaching jobs began to dry up, Peg began work on a second Master's in Library Science. On completing that degree, that prayer request was finally answered when she became a school librarian. The years teaching English had been fine, but this was her true calling and love. She would spend the last 15 years of her 39 year teaching career as Madam Librarian!

How did she get involved with Shelties? Her daughter who had border collies hooked her up with an Amish farmer who bred Shelties; and yes, later she understood it was a puppy mill. Still, she had her dear Sydney to love for almost 12 years. It would be another 20 years before she would get her second Sheltie, as she *just couldn't face the loss again*.









